Principles for practice



- Follow guidance documents for each student. Ask if unsure.
- Consent <u>every</u> time.
- Think about safety infection control, moving and handling etc.
- Dignity, privacy and respect
- Gentle and compassionate approach
- Learning opportunity and promoting independence
- Communication throughout in preferred way
- Choice making who, what, how
- No locked doors when staff in toilets and bathrooms with children
- Seek support from colleagues, managers and therapy teams

Training ideas



- Do staff know the anatomical language to describe body parts, especially regarding intimate areas?
 Ensure consistent, accurate and professional language is used (include language clarifications such as 'pad' rather than 'nappy'- nappy infantilises older children)
- 2. Ask staff to identify different care tasks that they perform on themselves each day which of these are intimate care and which are personal care?
- 3. Consider you require support with your personal and intimate care what would be important to you?
- 4. Create a fictitious personal and intimate care plan for a child and talk through this.
- Create a safe space for staff to ask any specific questions about how to perform personal/intimate care? Provide the first few questions to help:
 - If you have a female pupil needing help with toileting, which staff should and should not help?
 - What is the best way to change a child's pad?
 - How often should we change a child's pad?
 - When would you alert the DSL when providing intimate care?
 - If a child has an erection during intimate care, what would you do?
 - What are some hygiene considerations during intimate care?
 - How might you be personalised in your delivery of intimate care?
